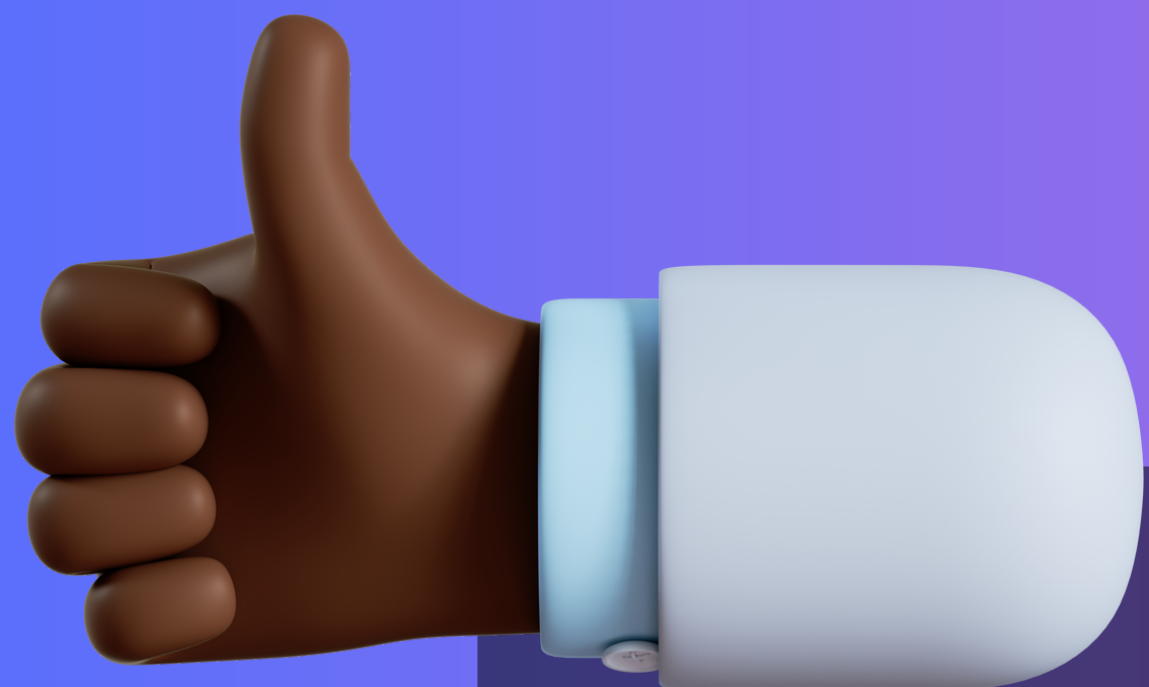
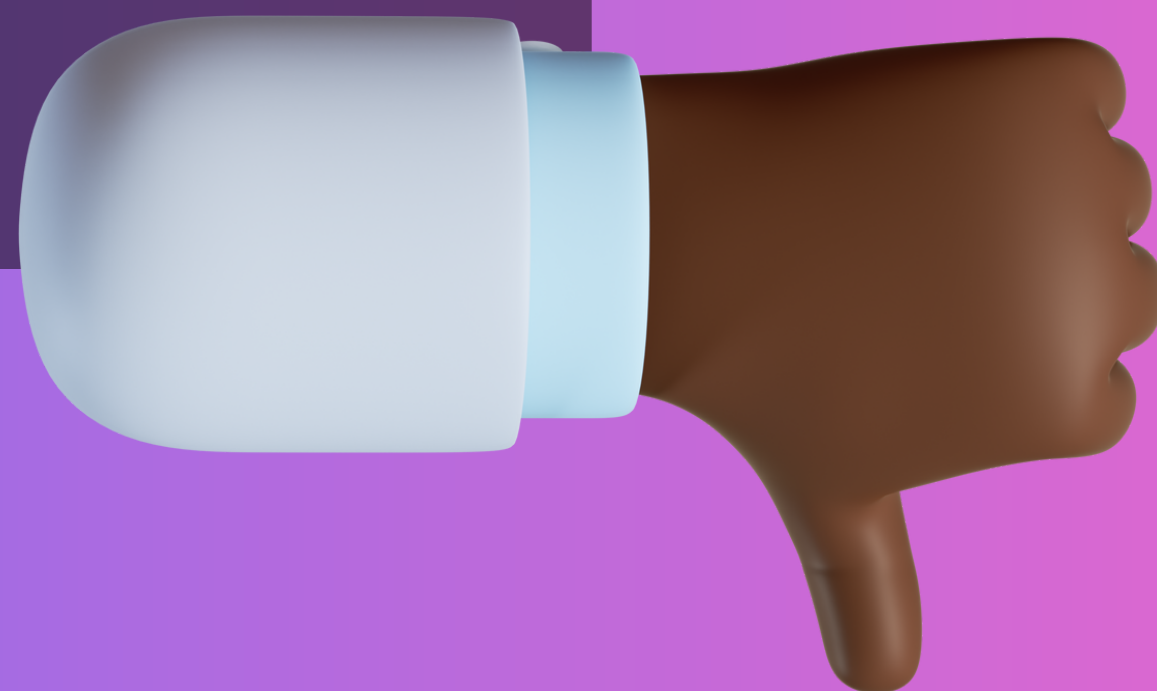

*"The purpose of **eugenics** was to accelerate the selection of the well-fitted over the ill-fitted, and the healthy over the sick."*

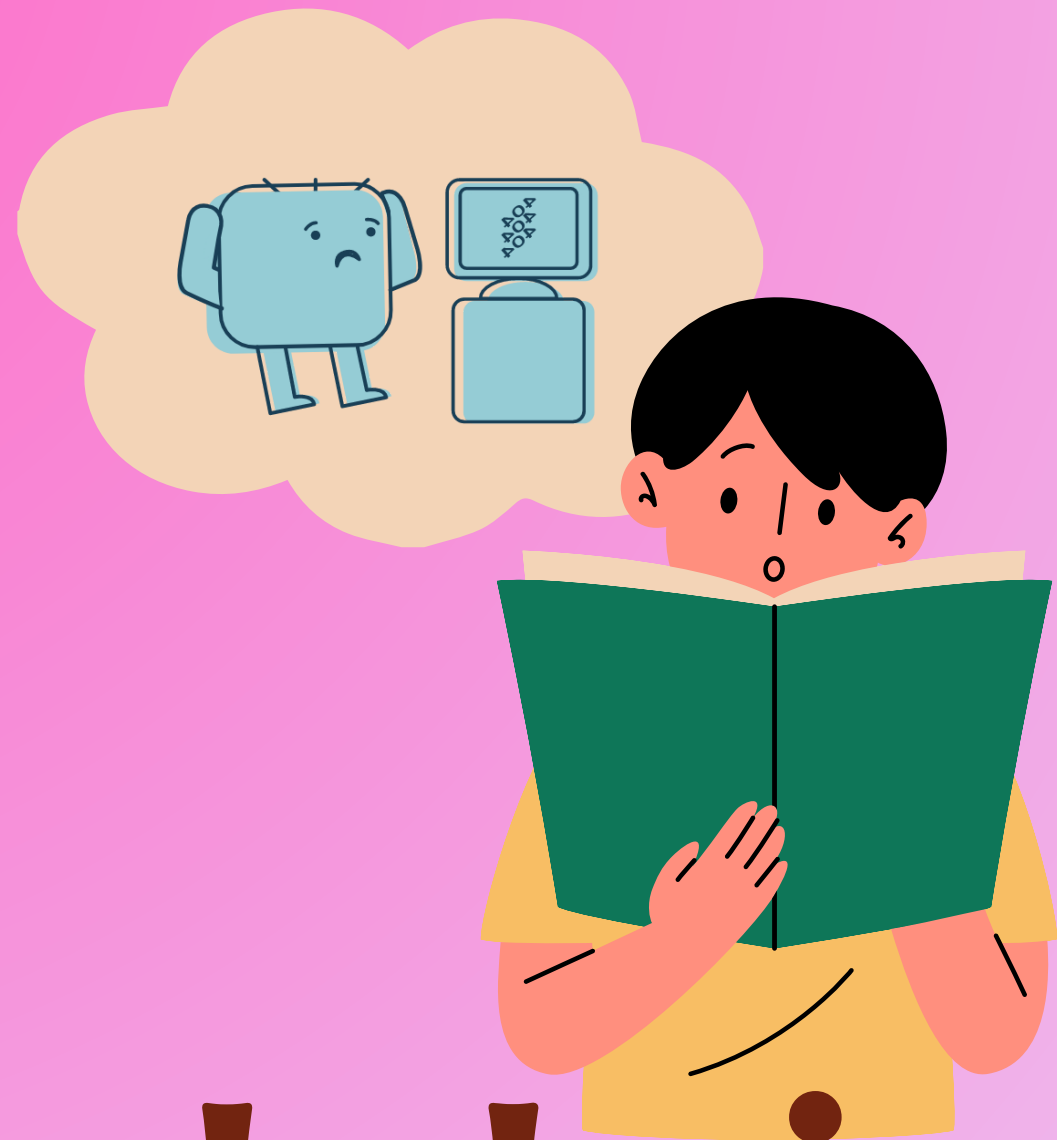

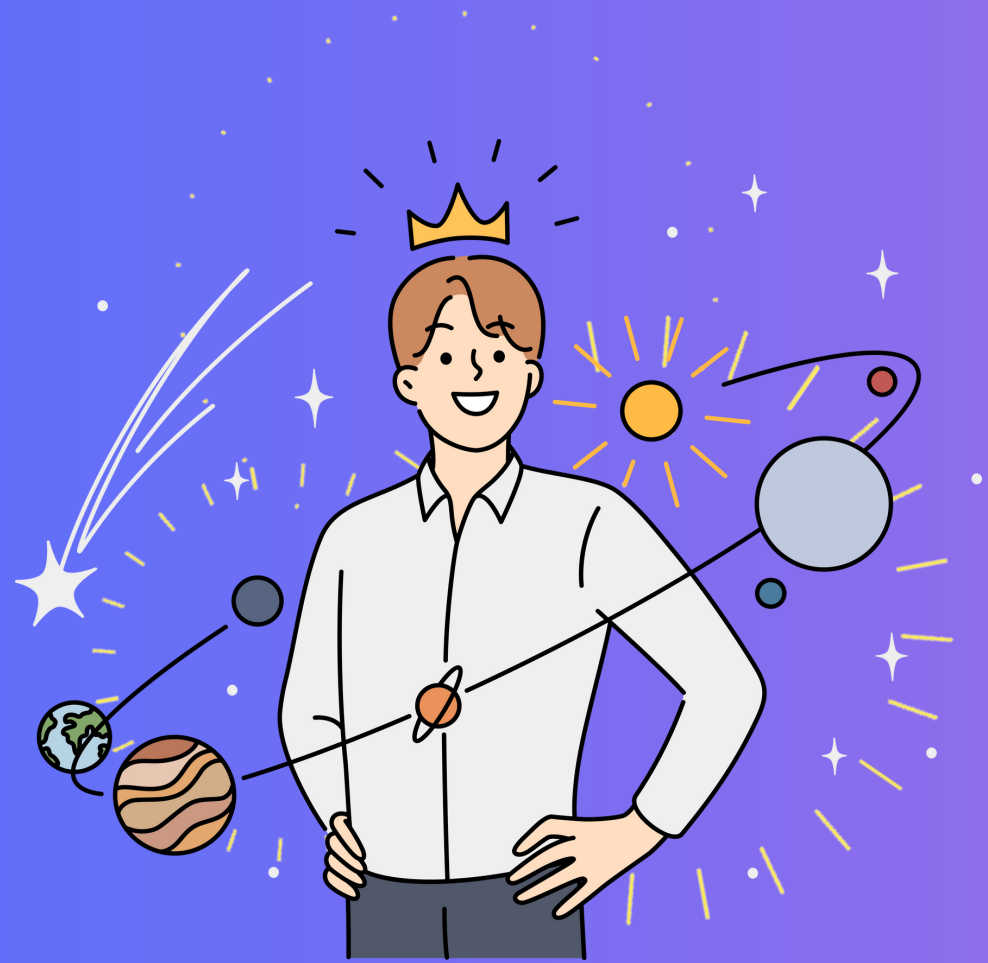

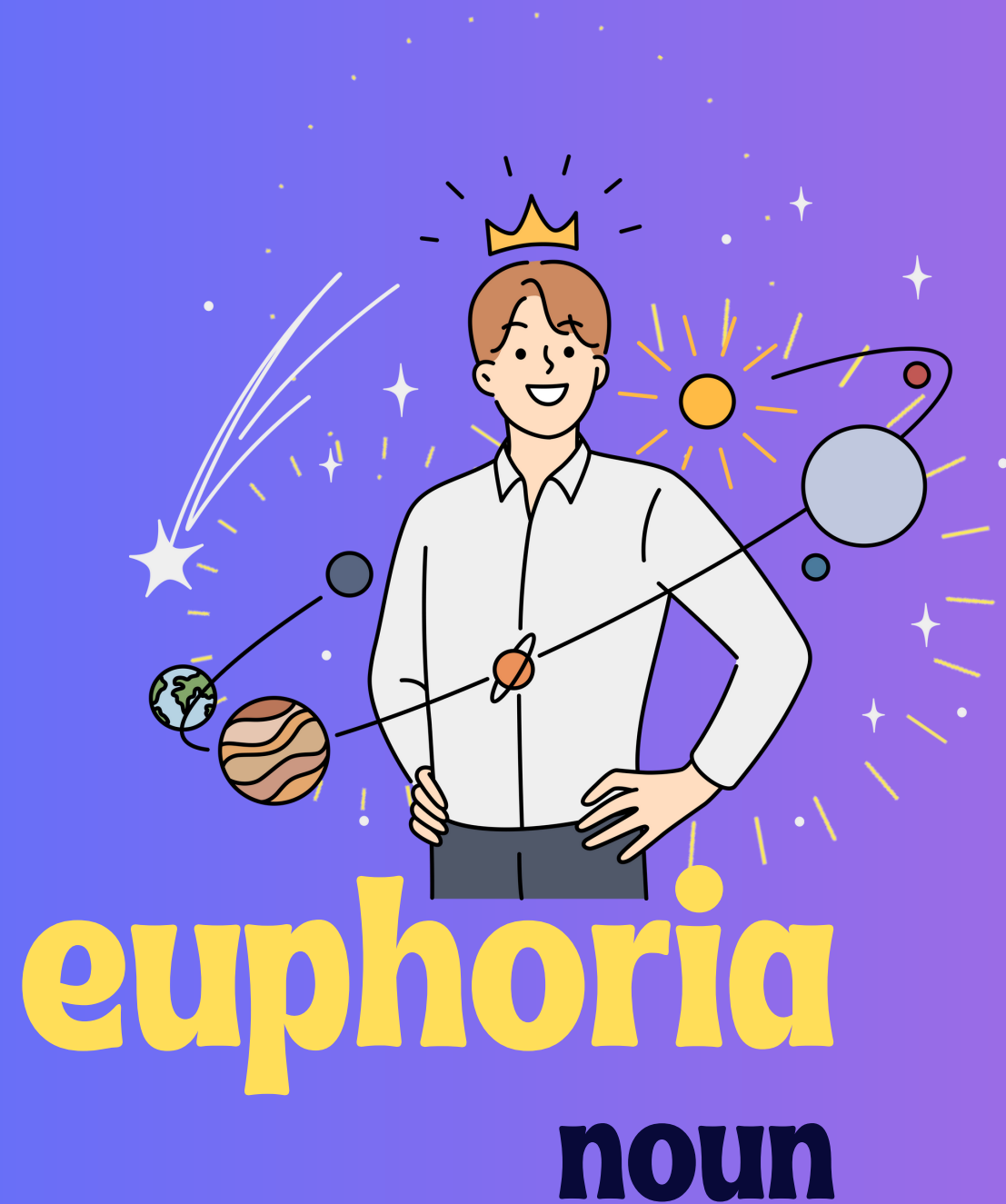

*"The feeling of **dysphoria** can sometimes be overwhelming, leading to a sense of disconnection from one's body and surroundings."*

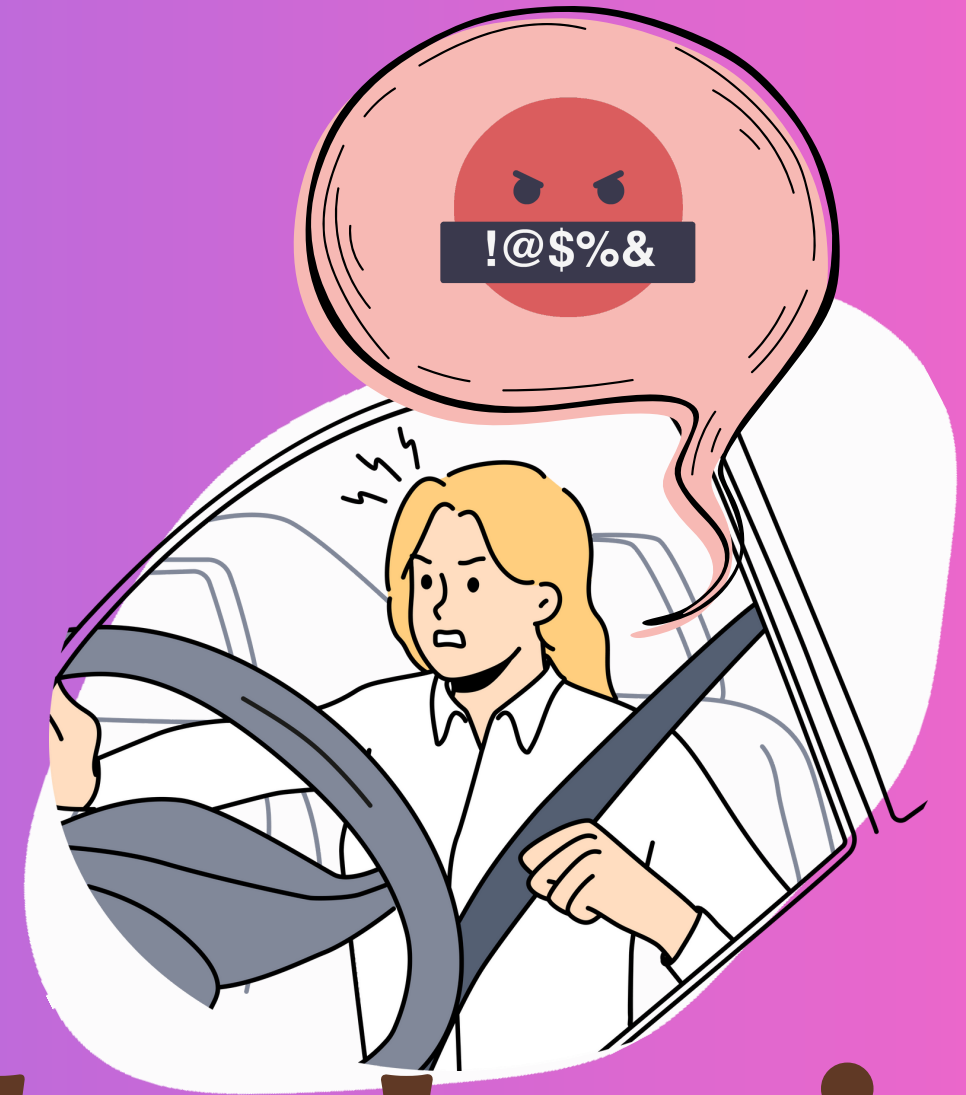

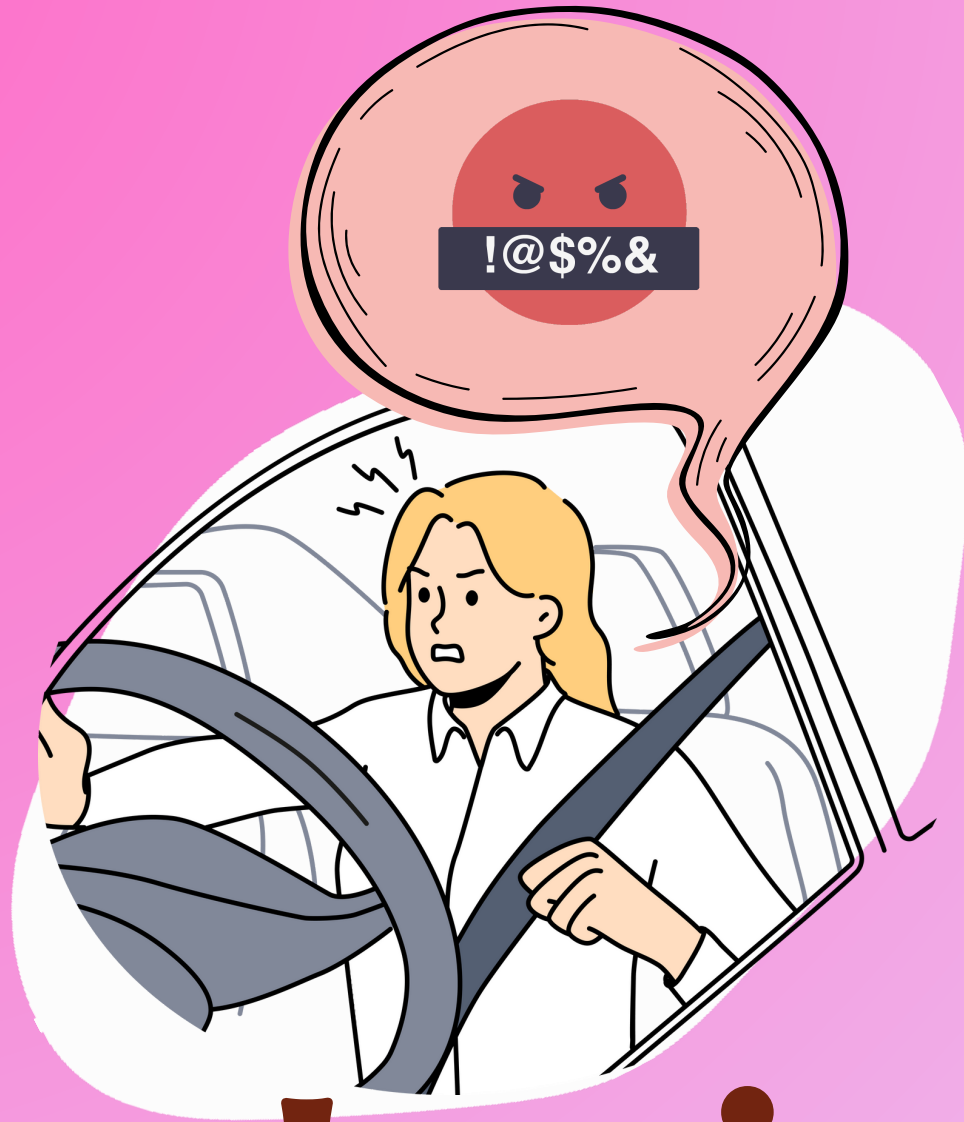
Definition:
