## Saraswathi, Pawani walk into record books

HISSAR, DEC. 4. Walkers Vadluri Saraswathi and Solipuram Pawani share a lot in common. The duo is almost of same age, hail from a similar background in Hyderabad and train together under coach T. Srinivas Rao at Andhra Pradesh Sports School. On Monday, they became the National record-holders in two different categories.

Saraswathi walked herself into the record books in the 5km event in the under-18 category, while, Pawani created a new mark in the under-16 3km event in the National inter-zonal athletics meet, which concluded at the Giri Centre, Haryana Agricultural University, here.

Fifteen year-old Saraswathi opted for the higher age group, with the aim of participating in next year's Asian Junior championship. And with her effort of 26 minutes, 34.7 seconds, the frail-built lass took a vital step towards her quest. "I hope to do better in the coming Na-

"I hope to do better in the coming National inter- state championship. I may better this timing as I could not give my best due to the cold conditions," said Saraswathi, who erased Paramjeet Kaur's name from the record books, improving upon the latter's mark by 1.3 seconds.

In contrast to the marginal improvement of the National record by Saraswathi, Pawani bettered the previous mark by 53.6 seconds as she completed the 3km course in 14 min. 44.7 secs.

"I had come with a target of 14:30 but I am still happy with my first win in the inter-zonal championship," said Pawani, who eclipsed L. Deepmala's timing, achieved in 1996.

Apart from those by the walkers, there were three other National records on the final day, all by North Zone athletes. The records were set by Mukesh in the boys' under-18 1500m, Ashis Kumar in the under-16 hammer and Suman Kumari in the girls' under-18 hammer.

A few more records could have been listed had there proper equipment support. The absence of wind gauge operator and photo finish arrangement meant the efforts of sprinters and a triple jumper would prove futile in terms of ratification.

"The inability of the operator (from Delhi) to reach at the venue was the reason for no electronic timing arrangement. The shuffling of dates also created confusion," said AAFI Secretary, Mr. Lalit Bhanot.

Those who suffered because of the inadequacy were Jaspreet Singh (100 metres, 10.5 seconds, men under-20), Sanjay Mishra (100 metres, 10.8 seconds, boys under-18) and Pritpal Singh (triple jumper, 15.94m, men under-20). Pritpal's effort should be considered the most outstanding, though no wind-reading was available.
