The Egyptians develop hieroglyphic writing.




2600 BC

1000 AD Modern standardized form of Devanagari started


1100 AD From Devanagari

First movable type invented clay - invented in China by Pi Sheng.




206-100 BC Paper was invented in ancient China during the Han dynasty
