

PARTS OF SPEECH



NOUN

A NOUN IS THE NAME OF A PERSON, PLACE, A THING OR AN IDEA.

EXAMPLES

GIRL, CHILDREN, BUILDING, SEASHORE,

FLOWER, KOLAM

PRONOUN

A pronoun is a word that is used instead of a noun.




Example

Rani went to the market. She bought vegetables there.

IPERSON - I, WE

II PERSON - YOU, YOU

III PERSON - HE, SHE, IT, THEY

ADJECTIVE

AN ADJECTIVE IS A WORD THAT QUALIFIES A NOUN OR A PRONOUN.













EXAMPLES

- 1. SHE IS FAT.
- 2. HE IS OLD.
- 3. THEY ARE PRETTY.

A VERB IS A WORD USED TO SAY SOMETHING ABOUT THE SUBJECT i.e action or state of being.





EXAMPLES

- 1. SHE WALKS FAST.
- 2. THE MAN IS READING THE NEWSPAPER.
- 3. HE WRITES NEATLY.

ADVERB

AN ADVERB IS A WORD THAT QUALIFIES A VERB, AN ADJECTIVE OR ANOTHER ADVERB.



the Advertos

He sang loudly.

(Tells how he sang.)

I play sport outside.

(Tells where I play sport.)

She always skips to the park.

(Tells when she skips to the park.)

Yesterday, we went to the movies.

(Tells when we went to the movies.)

We heard her softly-spoken words.

(Tells how the words were spoken.)


- are words that usually describe a verb.

PREPOSITION

A PREPOSITION IS A WORD THAT INDICATES THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN A NOUN OR PRONOUN AND OTHER WORDS IN A SENTENCE.

- 2. HE HAS GONE OUT.
- 3. GO THROUGH THE PAPER.
- 4.SHE IS GOING TOWARDS THE TEMPLE.

A CONJUNCTION IS A WORD USED FOR JOINING WORDS OR SENTENCES.


It is late, but I'm not tired.

Interjections

An interjection is a word that expresses a strong feeling or command.

They have no relation to the sentence it is in (the sentence would still be correct without it).

Moni Heri Hoolay


Oh no! Wait! Vippee!
