

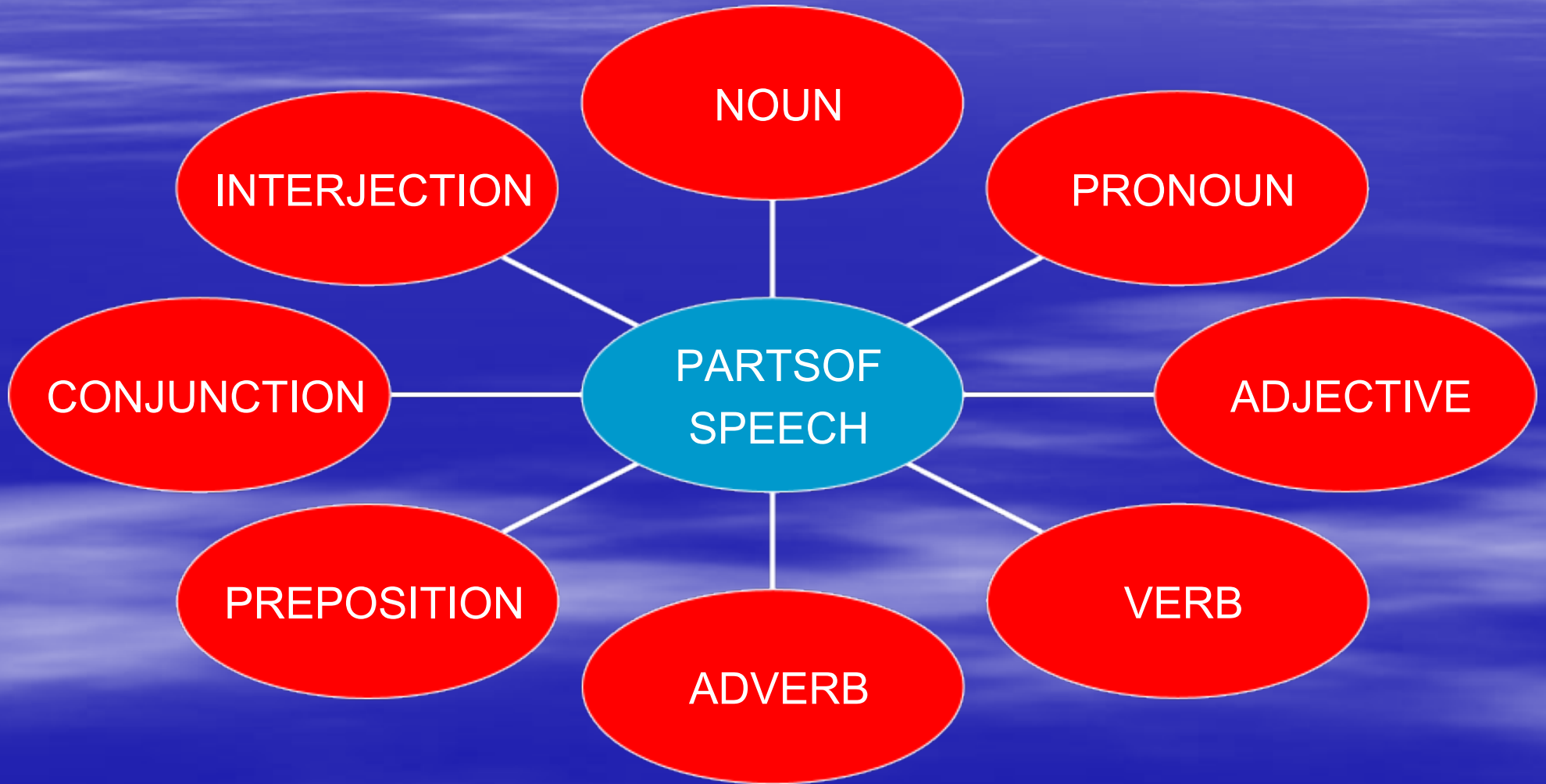

# ***NOUN***

***A NOUN IS THE NAME OF A PERSON,  
PLACE, A THING OR AN IDEA.***

## ***EXAMPLES***

***GIRL, CHILDREN, BUILDING, SEASHORE,  
FLOWER, KOLAM***

# ***PRONOUN***

***A pronoun is a word that is used instead of a noun.***



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## ***Example***

***Rani went to the market. She bought vegetables there.***

I PERSON - I, WE



II PERSON - YOU, YOU

III PERSON - HE, SHE, IT, THEY

# PRONOUNS

<i>Subject Pronouns</i>	<i>Object Pronouns</i>	<i>Possessive Adjectives</i>	<i>Possessive Pronouns</i>
I	me	my	mine
You	you	your	yours
He	him	his	his
She	her	her	hers
It	it	its	its
We	us	our	ours
You	you	your	yours
They	them	their	theirs



# ADJECTIVE



AN ADJECTIVE IS A WORD THAT QUALIFIES A NOUN OR A PRONOUN.





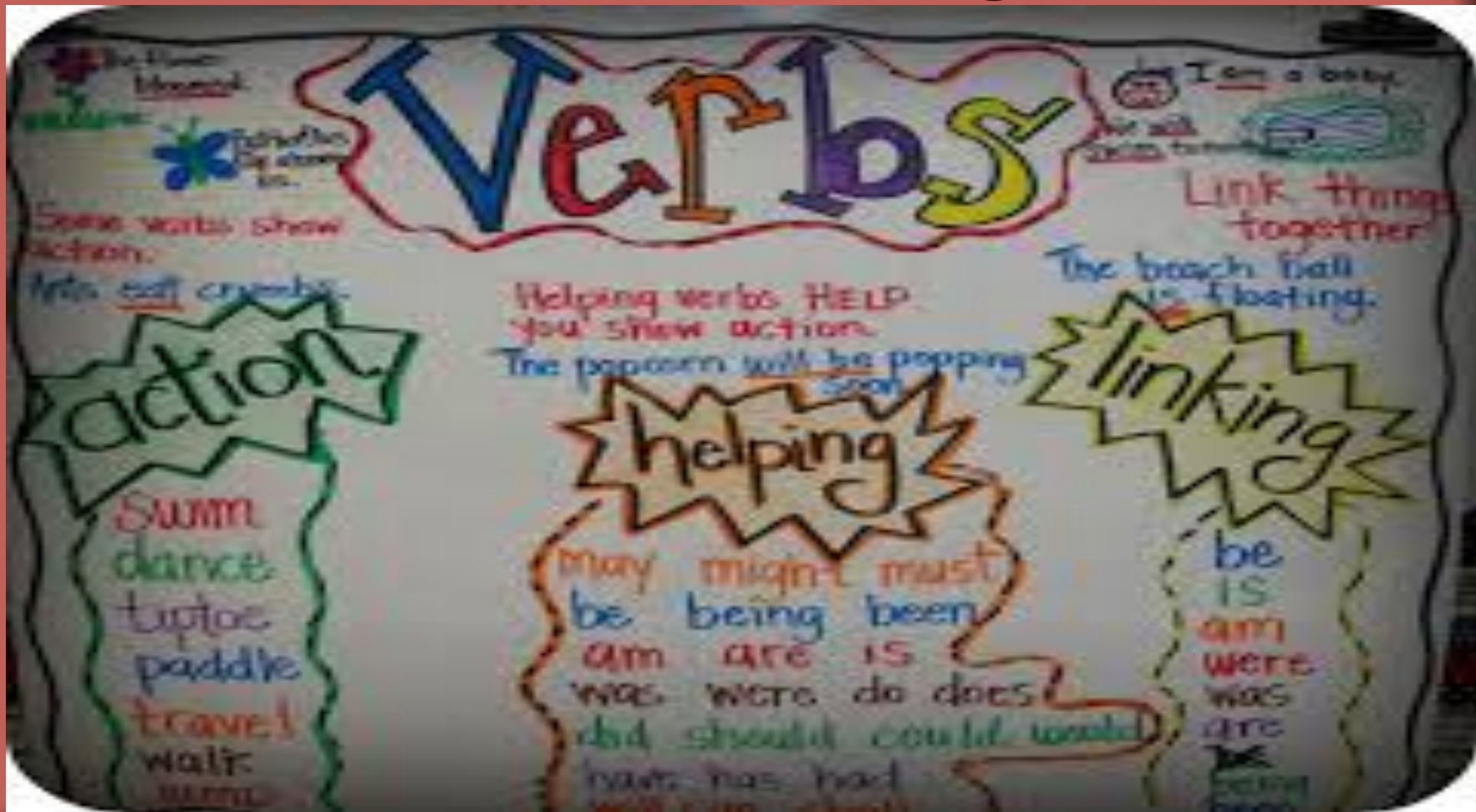


# EXAMPLES

1. SHE IS FAT.
2. HE IS OLD.
3. THEY ARE PRETTY.

# VERB

A VERB IS A WORD USED TO SAY SOMETHING ABOUT THE SUBJECT  
i.e action or state of being.





## EXAMPLES

1. SHE WALKS FAST.

2. THE MAN IS READING THE NEWSPAPER.

3. HE WRITES NEATLY.



# ADVERB

AN ADVERB IS A WORD THAT QUALIFIES A VERB, AN ADJECTIVE OR ANOTHER ADVERB.



# Adverbs

He sang **loudly**.

(Tells how he sang.)

I play sport **outside**.

(Tells where I play sport.)

She **always** skips to the park.

(Tells when she skips to the park.)

**Yesterday**, we went to the movies.

(Tells when we went to the movies.)

We heard her **softly**-spoken words.

(Tells how the words were spoken.)

- are words that usually describe a verb.
- can sometimes describe other words.
- can tell us how, when, and where.



# PREPOSITION

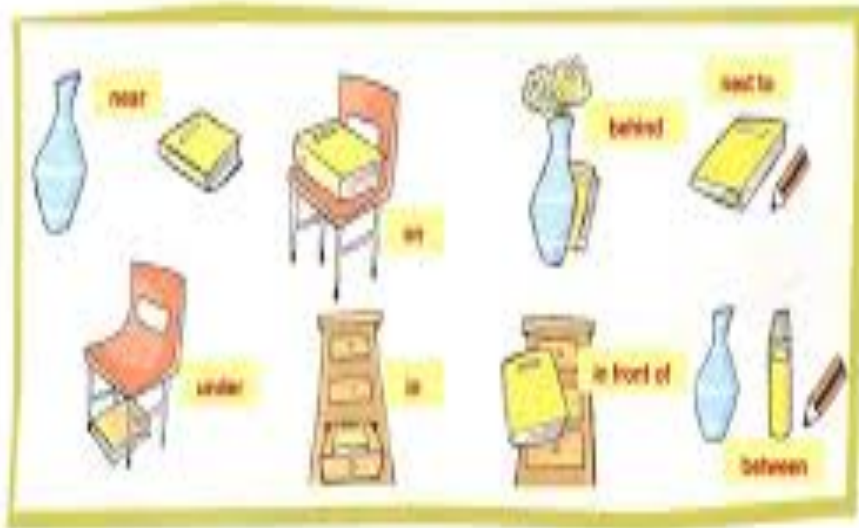
**A PREPOSITION IS A WORD THAT INDICATES THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN A NOUN OR PRONOUN AND OTHER WORDS IN A SENTENCE.**



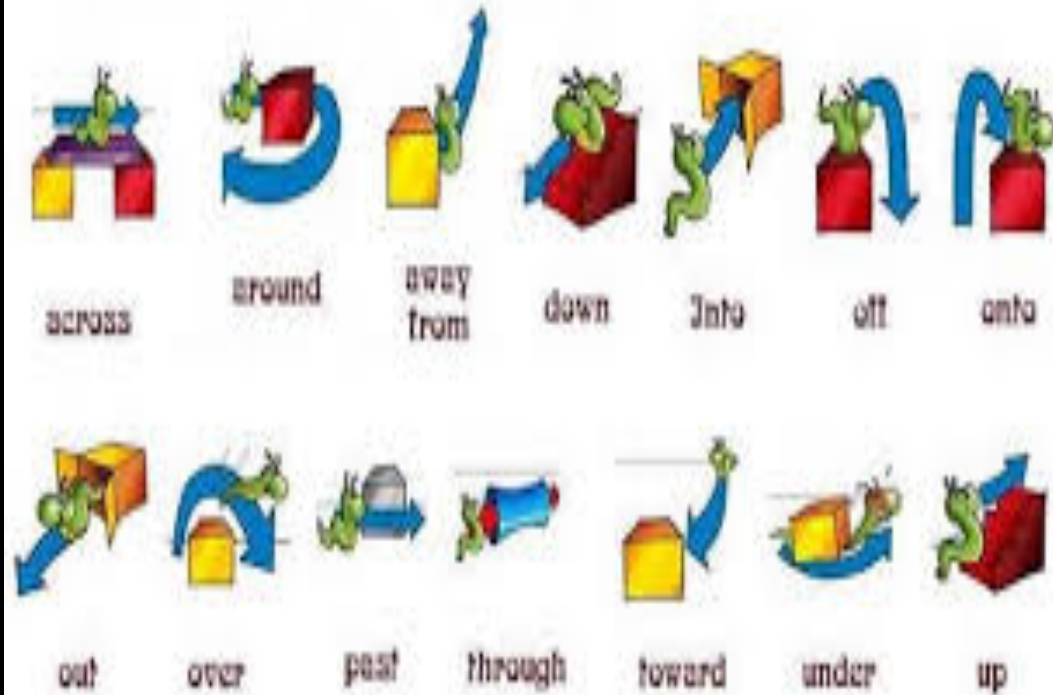

2. HE HAS GONE OUT.

A CONJUNCTION IS A WORD USED FOR JOINING WORDS OR SENTENCES.

words.

Yes **or** no?

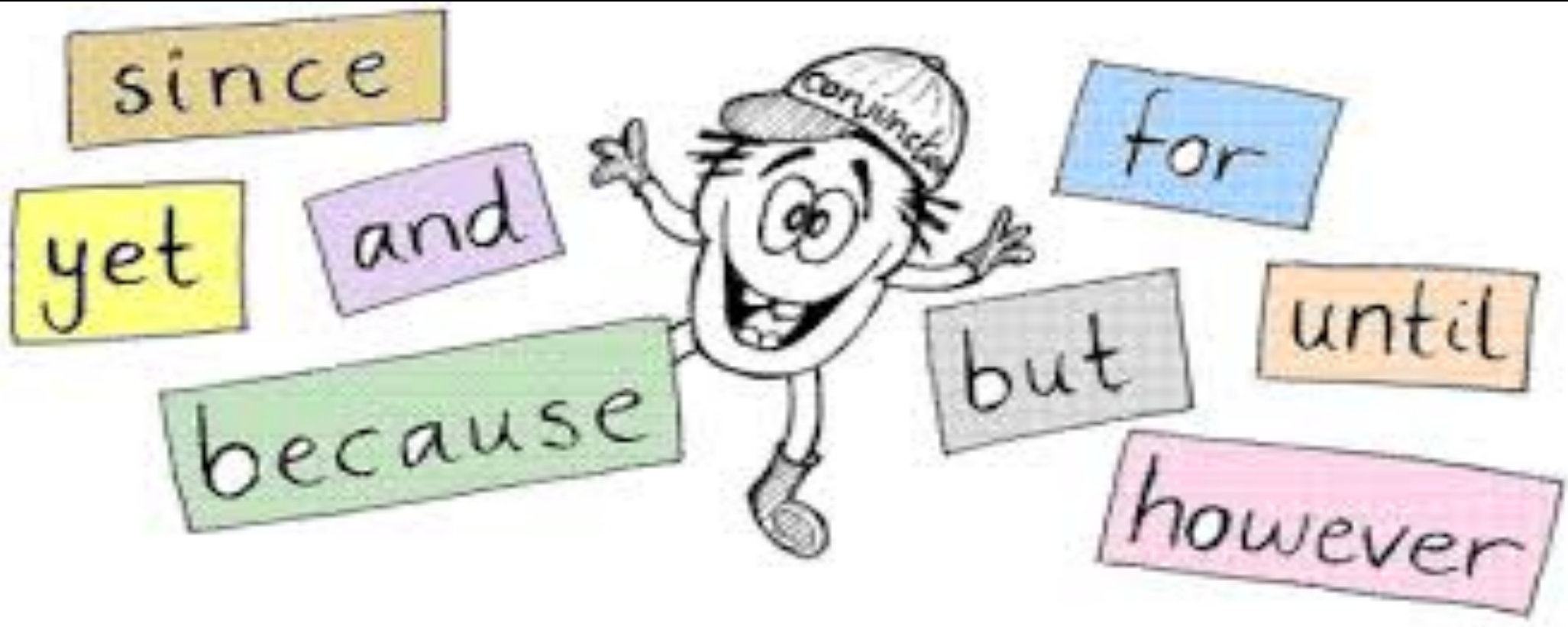
I am hungry **and** thirsty.

People **who** live in glass houses shouldn't throw stones.

**Because** he's older, my brother stays up later at night.

- AN INTERJECTION IS A WORD USED TO EXPRESS SUDDEN FEELINGS.

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**Interjections**

An interjection is a word that expresses a strong feeling or command.

They have no relation to the sentence it is in (the sentence would still be correct without it).

Do you know what these are:

Wow!

Hey!

Hooray!

Oh no!

Wait!

Yippee!

Shucks!

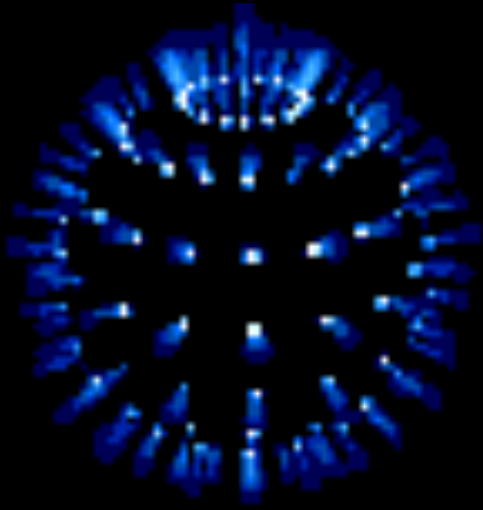
Ouch!
