The percentage of successful candidates in any competitive exam is hardly **10 to 15 percent** for any of these big coaching institutions. Talking about the classroom situation of these coaching institutes one may find more than 100 students seated in a single class with almost negligible attention to individual student’s problems. Moreover, the tuition fee charged by these institutions is so heavy that sometimes the parents and guardians have to take loans from banks to get their ward admitted in these institutes.

The remaining students, who could not crack the examination end up taking admission in **Tier-2 or Tier-3** colleges and institutions spread across the country. Some of these Institutions neither have the infrastructural facilities to support the courses offered by them nor have the qualified faculty to impart quality education. The placement cell of these institutions is only for the namesake. **After 4 to 5 years of study, finding a good job appears a formidable task.**

Even after two to three years of preparation and spending lakhs of rupees, unsuccessful students end up taking admission in an average or below average private engineering college which proves detrimental to their career. The success ratio of these coaching institutes is as low as **2 to 5 percent** in case of cities like Jaipur. Even after this dismal situation, the big coaching brands boasts of their excellent results in competitive exams year after year. However the ground reality is contrary to this.

Once the course is completed and results are out, nobody cares for the unsuccessful students. Not even a proper career counseling session is organized by these “big brands” to guide and tell these students and their worried parents about what to do next. This situation sometimes gives the unsuccessful student an inferiority complex.

What to do?
