Lesson Plan Activity: Discussion

Skill in Focus: Speaking & Interaction

Objective

To enable the learners to express ideas based on their thoughts, improve fluency.

Activity

To discuss on the questions put before the learners.

Stage 1: Warming Up

An Introduction. General Questions about their day. Topic specific questions may be asked as:

- 1. Do you analyse things before coming up to a conclusion?
- 2. How do you analyse any situation?

Stage 2: Introducing & Running the Activity

Introduce the activity to the learners and ask them to speak one by one. Ask them the following questions:

- 1. If you were given the opportunity to be born again, what would you change in your life?
- 2. If you could have dinner with someone, dead or alive, who would you choose and why?
- 3. If you always had to tell the truth, what kind of problems would you encounter?

- 4. If you could live without sleeping, how would you spend your nights?
- 5. If you were given a choice between great wisdom or great wealth, which would you choose?
- 6. If you could live forever on Earth, as it is now, would you? Why/Why Not?

Encourage interaction between the learners. Help them when required.

Stage 3: Closing the Activity

Close the activity by sharing your thoughts, and by reviewing on their speaking.

Stage 4: Conclusion

Close the session by giving your feedback for each learner and tips on improvement.

Understand Better
