# What are the documents that I will need for college applications?

You will need to prepare the following documents for college applications:

- 1. Letter of Motivation
- 2. Letters of Recommendation
- 3. Resume / Curriculum Vitae

Additionally, you will have to ensure that you take the required tests and have the following documents issued:

- 1. Academic Transcripts
- 2. A valid language proficiency test report (IELTS / TOEFL / PTE)
- 3. A valid aptitude test report, if applicable (GRE / GMAT/ SAT)
- 4. A valid passport
- 5. Proof of funds, if required by the university at the time of application (Bank Statement)

## How should I prepare my motivation letter?

Your motivation letter, also known as a statement of purpose, is the backbone of your application to top-tier universities. It is a 1-2 page document giving details about your academic, extra-curricular and personal experiences. It should also highlight your reasons for choosing the university and your future plans. You must take great care while preparing your letter of motivation so that stand out in the crowd and get noticed by the admissions committee of the university.

I will help you in planning an outline for your motivation letter and in writing it, which is a very time-consuming and tedious task otherwise.

## How many recommendation letters do I need and from whom?

Most of the universities require you to produce 3 letters of recommendation. If you are fresh out of college, then all the recommendations should be provided by your professors, while if you have work experience, then 1 letter should be professional and the other 2 academic. It also depends on the duration of your employment. For example, if you have more than 5 years of work experience, then you may be better off providing recommendations from your employer and clients instead of your professors. This will also depend on the guidelines issued by the college.

# How should I prepare my resume for college applications? Is it different from a professional resume?

Your resume for college applications should be ideally be a 1-page document highlighting your educational qualifications, work experience, certifications and extra-curricular achievements. A resume prepared for academic purposes such as applications is also called a curriculum vitae. It is different from a professional resume, which focuses more on your soft skills, technical skills, career objectives and what value you can bring to the organization.

## Will you help me in applying for scholarships?
