## **Main Difference**

government-organized area which deals with the security and also the development of all wild species.

## Wildlife Sanctuary vs. National Park

Wildlife Sanctuary is a relatively small piece of land under some experts who are concerned with the rehabilitation of the wild living beings, while National Park is a large area supervised and organized by the government for the protection and development of all the endangered and threatened species and ancient objects also.

Wildlife Sanctuary only keeps those species of wild animals and birds that are rare and provide them with a suitable and hygienic environment. In contrast, National Park conserves all the scarce wild species, unique articles and anticipate them with close enough natural habitat to make their existence and blooming possible to a greater extent.

Generally, the public is allowed for tourism and other purposes in Wildlife Sanctuaries, but ordinary people are not permitted to enter National Parks. No specific borderlines are found in Wildlife Sanctuaries, while the government recognizes strict margins for National Parks.

# What is Wildlife Sanctuary?

endangered. It can also be considered as an artificially managed zone to safeguard the wild beings from being hunted and abused. There are no strict boundaries recognized by the government or organization. People can visit for amusement or any other purpose, but the hunting of animals is completely prohibited. No individual permissions are needed to be taken to enter the Wildlife Sanctuary for research or recreational cause.

The purpose of the Wildlife Sanctuary is to reduce the risk of extinction of wild beings, and safety along with a healthy environment is provided to them. There are many Wildlife Sanctuaries in different parts of the world.

In the Wildlife Sanctuary, the animals treated in the best way. Animal testing is prohibited in the Wildlife Sanctuary. The parts or products like milk, eggs, etc. of animals are not commercialized. The animals can feel protective and an environment like their homes. One of the vital goals of the sanctuary is to educate the public. They work to change the thinking of humans and the way to treat animals.

The management of the sanctuary is also as important as its development. They hire guards or rangers that petrol around the region. They work to protect animals from predating and harassing the environment.

#### What is a National Park?

A National Park is a vast area that is under strict government control for the protection and development of all flora and fauna, historical objects, and rare articles. It primarily provides all the wild plants, animals, birds, and reptiles with natural habitat free from human influence so that that they can live and interbreed freely in nature.

Every day people are not allowed to enter the National Park as this area is under high reliability. Only experts or professionals are permitted to enter or make any change for the developmental cause. National parks are physically fenced and kept under security. There are many National Parks that are owned and regulated by the government in different countries throughout the world.

National Parks not only protect wildlife animals but also a source of heritage, in a way not to harm them, that will amuse future people.

Any act which can create a stressful environment for species is prohibited — the countries economy increases, which has more National Parks. Tourism increases the economic status of the country. The staff is hired for the supervision and conservation of animals.

- 4. No strict boundaries are found outside Wildlife Sanctuaries. On the other hand, fences under high securities surround the National Parks.
- 5. Human activities are allowed up to a specific limit in Wildlife
  Sanctuaries on the flip side. No such action is allowed in the National
  Park.
