

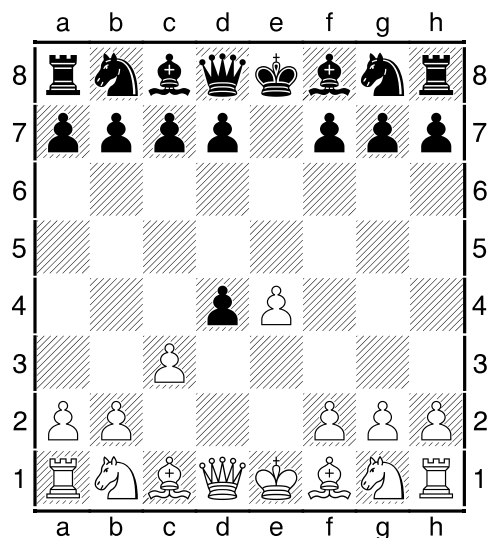
(2) Danish gamebit–legaltrap [C21]

1.e4 e5 2.d4 [2.Nc3]

2...exd4 [(The game started with the Danish Gambit:)]

3.c3 dxc3 4.Bc4 d6 [(This gambit is not fully correct but is very dangerous. If Black takes on b2, White gets a large lead in development.)]

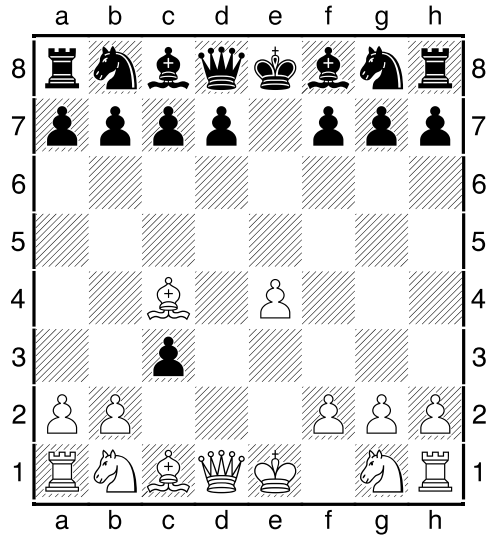


[4...cxb2 5.Bxb2]

5.Nxc3 [5.Bb5+ c6 6.Bc4; 5.Qh5 g6 6.Qd1; 5.e5]

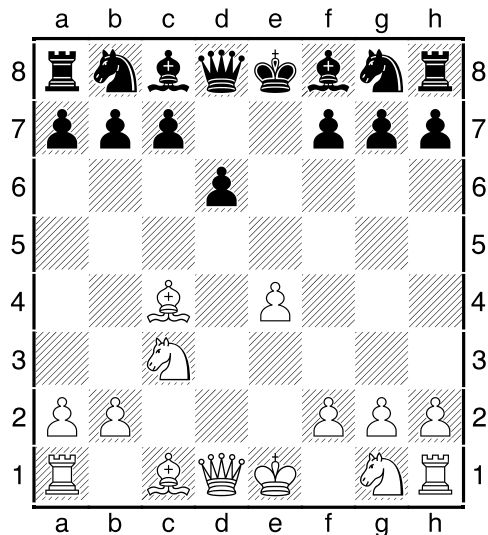
5...Nf6 6.Nf3 [6.Nb5 a6 7.Nc3 (7.Nxc7+ Qxc7)]

6...Bg4 [6...Nxe4 7.Nxe4]



7.0-0 [7.Bb5+ c6; 7.Qd4 Nc6]

7...Nc6 [7...d5 8.Bxd5 Nxd5 9.exd5 Qxd5]

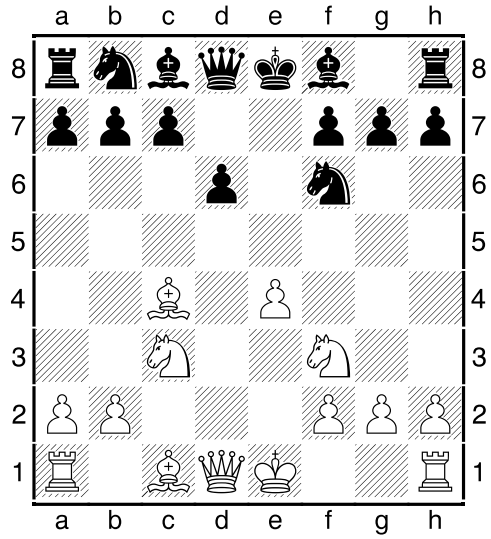


8.Bg5 [8.Qb3 Na5 9.Bxf7+ Kd7 (9...Ke7 10.Nd5+ Kxf7 11.Ng5+ Ke8 12.Nxf6+ Qxf6 13.Qb5+ c6 14.Qxa5 h6 15.Qc7) 10.Qb5+ (10.Qa4+ Nc6 11.Nd4) 10...c6; 8.Ng5]

8...Ne5? [(White's last move has set a trap into which Black falls. The knight move allows Legal mate)]

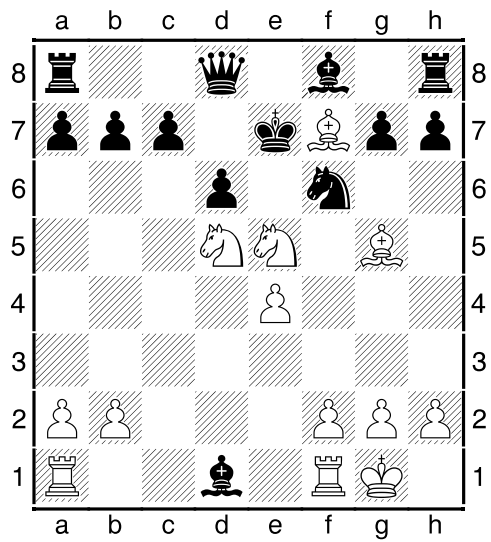
9.Nxe5! [9.Nd5 Nxd5 (9...Be7) 10.Bxd8 Kxd8; 9.Qd5 Nxd5; 9.Qd4; 9.Qa4+ c6 10.Qxc6+ bxc6]

9...Bxd1 [(It has to be mentioned that Black's best response is declining the Greek Gift with Δ d6xe5, but then White captures the bishop on g4 and remains a piece up.)]



[9...dxe5 10.Qxg4 Nxg4 11.Bxd8]

10.Bxf7+ Ke7 11.Nd5#
