2. Do children make mistakes easily?


Yes, children make mistakes very easily. They are very young and making mistakes is part and parcel of learning.

3. What should parents do if their children make mistakes?


Parents should guide their children if they make mistakes. They should teach their children in a very friendly way so that children are not afraid of telling them their mistakes in future.
