
bliss

euphoric




(adj) characterized by or feeling intense excitement and happiness.

(adj) optimistic or positive, especially in an apparently bad or difficult situation.

vigorous

- The best instructors have vigorous teaching styles. lively enough to make any lesson interesting.

Definition: lively and animated

- Taylor Swift was very vivacious during her performance, she was full of energy.
- The baby laughed vivaciously.

extrovert

introvert (noun)
