Advertise (v)

['ædvətɑɪz]

Mean: To advertise is to tell people about something on TV, radio, etc.

Example: They used a rabbit to help them advertise their product.

Adverse (adj)

['ædvɜ:s]

Mean: If something is adverse, then it is harmful.

Example: Not eating healthy foods can have an adverse effect on your health.

Surmount (Verb)



/sə'maʊnt/

[sar..maaunt]

Meaning

to deal successfully with a difficulty or problem

to be successful, to overcome

Example

We are fully confident that we can surmount these difficulties.

Adventure (n)

[əd'ventʃə]

Mean: An adventure is a fun or exciting thing that you do.

Example: Riding in the rough water was an adventure.

Inflation (Noun)



/ɪnˈfleɪ.ʃən/

[ɪnfleshən]

Meaning

a general, continuous increase in prices:

Example

Inflation needs to be controlled in India.

Advent (n)

['ædvənt]

Mean: An advent is the arrival or beginning of an important person, thing, or event.

Example: During the advent of radio, very few programs actually played music.

Admit (v)

[əd'mɪt]

Mean: To admit something means to say that it is true.

Example: I had to admit that I stole his idea.

Precarious (Adj.)



/prɪ'keə.ri.əs/ /prɪkerias/

Meaning

dangerous and unstable, hazardous

Example

The whole world is in a precarious situation because of the Coronavirus.

Adorn (v)

[ə'dɔ:n]

Mean: To adorn something means to make it more beautiful by decorating it.

Example: Small glass beads adorned the vase.

Admission (n)

[əd'mɪʃ(ə)n]

Mean: Admission is the act of allowing to enter a place.

Example: The admission ticket to the movie was \$5.

Ambivalent (Adj.)



/æm'bi.v.ə.lənt/ [aimbivalent]

Meaning

having two different feelings about somebody or something at the same time

Example

She is so ambivalent about her marriage now.

Adopt (v)

[ə'dɒpt]

Mean: To adopt someone is to make them as a part of one's own family.

Example: The girl was adopted by the couple when she was three.

Envisage (Verb)



/ɪnˈvɪz.ɪdʒ/ [ɪnvɪzɪj]

Meaning

to imagine, to visualize, think up, to envision

Example

Do you envisage any difficulty working with them?

Adolescent (n)

[,æd(ə)'les(ə)nt]

**Mean: An adolescent is
a young person or a teenager.**

**Example: The adolescent was excited
about getting a skateboard
for his birthday.**

Admonish (v)

[əd'mɒnɪʃ]

Mean: To admonish someone is to tell them you disapprove of their behavior.

Example: The teacher admonished Mark because he was chewing gum in class.
