Passé Composé vs. Imparfait

The Passé Composé is used to...

- recall a completed action or event
- recall an event or action that happened only once
- recall an event or action when the time frames are stated
- talk about the beginning or the ending of an event or action

Examples in English:

- ~She caught the ball.
- ~He scored a touchdown.
- ~The Redskins won the game.
- ~I ate dinner at 6:00 last night.
- ~It rained for three hours.
- ~He walked at the age of one. (He began to walk then.)
- ~I found out the truth. (I began to know the truth.)

The Imparfait is used to...

- tell time in the past
- tell age in the past
- describe in the past (details, scene setting)
- relate mental, physical, or emotional states in the past
- relate that somebody /something used to _____
- relate that somebody /something was/were ____ing
- talk about habitual, repeated, customary events in the past
- make general statements about that past that are not specific
- focus on one or more actions in progress at a certain point in the past
- describe what happens during the middle of an event

Examples in English:

- ~ It was 5:00 in the morning.
- ~ She was 12 years old.
- ~ We were very happy.
- ~ We used to play baseball everyday after school.
- ~ She was studying.
- ~ It was a dark and stormy night
- ~ Once upon a time
