


Cornawalli implemented


Kotwal – station in charge


Chowkidhar - Village in charge


The Impact of British Rule in India Military system

British appointed Indians for the military and took under the control of entire India


Officers were Britishers and Soliders were Indians

The Impact of British Rule in India The Modern Education System 1830

Macaulay was appointed as the Chairperson of Committee on Education

He wanted to create new class of Indians "Indian by body but British in intelligence, opinion and taste".

Impact:

- Indians could develop modernity, democratic attitude
- Impetus received for local literature and languages.
- Periodicals started emerging.




Foundation of British education

- British planned to educate a small section of upper and middle classes to create a class "Indian in blood and colour but English in taste.
- Producing civil servants
- Christian Missionaries: wanted to promote
