

## CONJUGATION OF IRREGULAR VERBS; Present Tense ending in `ir`

Though we have regular verbs ending in `ir` like `finir`, `choisir`, `remplir` we have a few verbs ending in `ir` which are irregular.

(Just to recollect what you have learnt, the regular verbs ending in `ir` have the endings `is, is, it, issons, issez, issent`)

Some IRREGULAR verbs ending in `ir` are given below:-

	<b>venir</b>	<b>sortir</b>	<b>partir</b>
	<b>to come</b>	<b>To go out/ to exit</b>	<b>to leave /to depart</b>
<b>Je</b>	<b>viens</b>	<b>sors</b>	<b>pars</b>
<b>Tu</b>	<b>viens</b>	<b>sors</b>	<b>pars</b>
<b>Il/Elle</b>	<b>vient</b>	<b>sort</b>	<b>part</b>
<b>Nous</b>	<b>venons</b>	<b>sortons</b>	<b>partons</b>
<b>Vous</b>	<b>venez</b>	<b>sortez</b>	<b>partez</b>
<b>Ils /Elles</b>	<b>viennent</b>	<b>sortent</b>	<b>partent</b>

Though the following verbs end in `ir` they are conjugated with endings just like regular `er` verbs.

(Just to recollect the endings for regular verbs ending in `er` are e, es, e, ons, ez, ent)

**IRREGULAR verbs ending `ir' with endings like Regular `er' verbs**

	<b>souffrir</b>	<b>couvrir</b>	<b>ouvrir</b>	<b>offrir</b>
	<b>to suffer</b>	<b>to cover</b>	<b>to open</b>	<b>to offer</b>
<b>Je</b>	<b>souffr<u>e</u></b>	<b>couvre</b>	<b>J'ouvre</b>	<b>J'offre</b>
<b>Tu</b>	<b>souffr<u>es</u></b>	<b>couvres</b>	<b>ouvres</b>	<b>offres</b>
<b>Il/Elle</b>	<b>souffr<u>e</u></b>	<b>couvre</b>	<b>ouvre</b>	<b>offre</b>
<b>Nous</b>	<b>souffr<u>ons</u></b>	<b>couvrons</b>	<b>ouvrons</b>	<b>offrons</b>
<b>Vous</b>	<b>souffr<u>ez</u></b>	<b>couvrez</b>	<b>ouvrez</b>	<b>offrez</b>
<b>Ils /Elles</b>	<b>souffr<u>ent</u></b>	<b>couvrent</b>	<b>ouvrent</b>	<b>offrent</b>

Though these above verbs end in `ir' and are irregular it is easy to remember the conjugation.

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
