- Change of heart change of opinion She was going to sell her house but had a change of heart at the last minute.
- 4. Piece of cake easy The exam was a piece of cake.
- 5. On point Absolutely correct She was on point with the answer.
- 6. Beat around the bush to speak indirectly without coming to the topic Don't beat around the bush and tell me frankly what you think of my dress.
- 7. Call it a day Decide to stop working for the day Let's call it a day.
- Get out of hand lose control The police were instructed to take action if things got out of hand.
- 9. Hang in there To believe in oneself or stay calm I know you have gone through a lot of difficulties but hang in there.
- 10. Better late than never delayed achievement is better than not reaching the goal at all. I know that it took me weeks to send the letter, but better late than never.

That is a huge building.

That is the largest building in the city.

That palace looks enormous.

That palace is massive.

That is a giant building.

That building looks gigantic.

The building in the corner of the street is humungous
