



WHAT IS IELTS?

- **IELTS (International English Language Testing System) is a standardized test designed to assess the language proficiency of individuals who are non-native English speakers and intend to study, work, or live in English-speaking countries.**
- **IELTS is jointly owned by the British Council; IDP IELTS; and Cambridge University Press & Assessment.**

TYPES OF TESTS

IELTS ACADEMIC

This version is intended for individuals who plan to study at a higher education institution in an English-speaking country or who need to demonstrate their English language proficiency for academic purposes.

IELTS GENERAL

This version is more suitable for individuals who are seeking work experience, training programs, or immigration to an English-speaking country.




IELTS TEST OPTIONS

PAPER- BASED

In the traditional paper-based format, test-takers receive printed question papers and write their answers on the provided answer sheets. The components of the test (Listening, Reading, Writing, and Speaking) are all conducted on paper.

COMPUTER- DELIVERED IELTS

In this format, the Listening, Reading, and Writing components are taken on a computer. The Speaking component is still conducted face-to-face with an examiner. The computer-delivered test offers more flexibility in terms of test dates and faster results.



IELTS Modules

Listening

- **Duration:** 30-40 mins
- **Sections:** 4
- **Questions:** 40
- There are 6 question types.

Reading

- **Duration:** 60 mins
- **Questions:** 40
- **Format:**
Academic: 3 passages
General: 4-5 short texts
- There are 7 question types.

Writing

- **Duration:** 60 mins
- **Questions:** 2 Tasks
- **Format:**
Academic: Report & Essay writing
General: Letter & Essay writing

Speaking

- **Duration:** 11-14 mins
- **Parts:** 3
- **Format:** Conversation & Monologue
