
Active and passive voice

He has to teach us. We have to be taught by him


Someone is following us.

Very common rule is:

- Bring the object first object +
- Choose correct 'be' verb 'be' verb terb 3+
- Change verb into participle by 4
- Add by + subject subject

- We have been taught a good lesson by the story.
- A good lesson has been taught to <u>us</u> by the story.
- has/ have/ had/ is/ am/ are/ was/ were + to + v1

She has to help us.

We have to be helped by her.

We have to learn English. English has to be learnt.

I had to wait the bus.

The bus had to e waited by me.

has, have, had to + v1 = has, have, had + to be + v3

Modal auxiliary verbs

can, could, shall, should, may, might, will, would, must

+v1 = modal + be + v3

She can speak Chinese.

Chinese can be spoken by her.

We must preserve the tigers.

Tigers must be preserved.

must have, should have, could have, might have, would have + v3 =

must have, should have, could have, might have, would have + been + v3

He should have stolen my pen.

My pen should have been stolen by him.

They must have left any sign.

Any sign must have been left.

No need to add 'by + sub' if the subject is:

we, they, someone, somebody, none, nobody, everybody, people ect

They have stolen my pen. My pen has been stolen.

They must have left any sign. Any sign must have been left.

Negative sentences remain negative

They have not stolen my pen. My pen has not been stolen.

They must not have left any sign.

Any sign must not have been left.

Nobody has done homework.

Homework has not been done.

Future perfect ( will / shall + have + v3)
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Future perfect (will/ shall + have + been + v ing)

ob + will / shall + have been + v3)

Passive ob+

Not used commonly

will/ shall + be + v3 not common in passive

She will write beautiful poems.

Beautiful poems will be written by her.

He will have done homework.

Homework will have been done by him.

beautifullywritten by her.

beautifully adverb goes just

before verb 3

He handled the load <u>carefully</u>.

The load was <u>carefully</u>handled by him.

Passive of 'yes / No' question

Can you speak English?
Can English be spoken
by you?

Has he helped them?
Have they been helped by him?

Did you help him? Was he helped by you?

they ell you? What were you told?


Who questions are changed in 2 ways.

By whom was the door opened?
