








Colourful Eyeshadow



Colourful eyeshadow is similar to smokey eyeshadow, but much more vibrant. Complimenting and contrasting colours are played together for an all over bold and glamorous look.

<p>1</p> 	<p>Make a palette of colours you want to use. This one is:</p>  <p>On a layer in 'multiply', fill in with the lightest colour.</p>	<p>2</p> 	<p>Shade in the area highlighted with a darker colour, and blend this in with the base colour.</p>
<p>3</p> 	<p>Shade in the area highlighted with the darkest colour in the palette, and blend into the rest of the shadow.</p>	<p>4</p> 	<p>Add the contrasting colour onto the lid. You may need to make it lighter and/or more saturated for it to show up well.</p>
<p>5</p> 	<p>Blend out the top colour. Remember that the layer is on 'multiply', so you'll need to blend with white rather than with the skin tone.</p>	<p>6</p> 	<p>Add a new layer on 'screen' mode. Add highlights in the area shown. You can create a sparkly effect by drawing dots or using a brush that scatters.</p>

Don't be afraid to experiment with different colour palettes! You can take inspiration from real makeup tutorials or looking at the colours on real eyeshadow palettes.
